UPGRADING ENTEBBE INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT FOR A BETTER PASSENGER EXPERIENCE

Entebbe International Airport's modified terminal building was opened to the public in January 2024 and all facilities are operational and running smoothly.

The imminent commission of a new 20,000 sqm terminal connecting to the current terminal will enhance terminal capacity to at least 3.5 million passengers per year.

The existing and ongoing upgrades being implemented are part of a 20-year National Aviation Master Plan aimed at catering to the growing traffic at Entebbe Airport and enhancing the passenger experience.

With World Polio Day on 24 October, I'm proudly rooting for Rotary as we team up around the world to End Polio Now.

I had the honor of attending a Strike Out Polio event in July at PNC Park, home of the Pittsburgh Pirates MLB team. The Rotary Club of DelmontSalem hosted the event, which raised \$1.3 million for PolioPlus.

Later in the summer, I joined members of our Rotary family in supporting the Más Millas Menos Polio (More Miles Less Polio) bike ride. Felipe Meza Chávez and his team rode all the way from Ciudad Juárez, Mexico, to One Rotary Center in Evanston, Illinois, to raise money and awareness. The ride took 12 days, and Felipe and his team collected more than \$100,000 to support the fight against polio. It was a joy to greet them as they arrived in Evanston.

And I was thrilled to see Team End Polio raise global awareness around the 2024 Paris Olympics. This world-class roster of athletes, global leaders, and polio eradication supporters came together to advocate for a world where no child has to live in fear of being paralyzed by polio. Some of the athletes on Team End Polio are polio survivors themselves, adding weight to their advocacy.

These are just a few examples of the many

ways Rotary has teamed up recently to End Polio Now. It is vital that we continue to seek out and recruit

teammates in polio eradication, especially after the challenges our eradication efforts have faced this year.

The Rotary world was heartbroken to learn about the tragic passing in August of Aidan O'Leary, director for polio eradication at the World Health Organization.

I knew Aidan and worked with him directly. He was a tireless advocate in the fight against polio and a kind, genuine man. We will remember him both for his advocacy and his warmth.

But where there is hardship, there is also hope. I feel hopeful whenever I consider the countless ways Rotary supports the fight every day to eradicate polio.

As people of action, we don't have the luxury of giving in to despair, even in the face of tragedy. The best way to honor Aidan's memory is by teaming up and reaching our goal to End Polio Now.

We made a promise to the children of the world and their families. It is incumbent upon us, together with our global partners, to end this threat once and for all.

There are so many ways we can team up to eradicate polio. You can donate to the End Polio Now campaign, join or initiate a PolioPlus Society in your club or district, or take inspiration from the fundraisers I mentioned above.

I encourage Rotary members around the world to continue to seek out new teammates, so that together, we end polio.

INCREASING OUR IMPACT

Namayingo Medical Camp (July 26th – 28th, 2024)

In a bid to improve health access in the Namayingo community, the Rotary Club of Bwebajja hosted a medical camp offering free services to over 2,800 people. The camp provided vital healthcare, including general medical consultations, maternal health services, and distribution of mosquito nets. Additionally, we donated a water tank, clothing, and planted trees, contributing to both health and environmental sustainability. The total expenditure for this impactful project was UGX 26 million. This initiative has significantly improved health outcomes in Namayingo and highlighted the importance of preventative care and environmental conservation.



Buzzi Impact Day (July 18th, 2024)

Led by our Buddy Group Buzzi, this project focused on maternal and child health. We donated 80 mama kits to expectant mothers at Kitala Health Center II and provided baby clothing. Tree planting was also incorporated to promote environmental awareness in the community. The project, which cost approximately UGX 3 million, addressed critical health needs and created a lasting impact for both the women and the environment. This initiative demonstrates our club's commitment to improving maternal health and supporting sustainable practices.



Seedlings for Sustainability (July 1st, 2024)

In an effort to promote environmental conservation, the Rotary Club of Bwebajja launched the "Seedlings for Sustainability" initiative by planting 800 fruit trees across 10 schools on Entebbe Road. This project not only contributes to environmental sustainability but also provides a source of future nourishment for the students. The initiative, which cost over UGX 4 million, will have a lasting impact on these schools, improving both the environment and food security. This is a strong step towards creating a greener future for our communities.



Buddy Group Kawuku in Mbarara (August 2024)

Our Buddy Group Kawuku led a humanitarian project in Mbarara, donating essential food items and a water tank to a local community in need. This project, with a total cost of over UGX 7 million, directly addressed issues of food security and water access, critical for the well-being of the residents. The donation of a water tank will ensure sustainable access to clean water, while the food items provided immediate relief. This initiative showcases our club's continued commitment to supporting communities across Uganda.



Schools Career Fair (September 28th, 2024)

The Rotary Club of Bwebajja held an Interact Career Fair at Kisubi High School, attracting over 800 students from various schools. The event provided a platform for students to engage with professionals from over 10 companies, offering invaluable career guidance and inspiration. The fair, which cost over UGX 7 million, aimed to empower students with the knowledge and skills needed to make informed career choices. By connecting students with industry leaders, this initiative fosters the next generation of professionals and leaders, creating a brighter future for all.

HONORARY MEMBERS My Journey with RC Bwebajja



I first encountered the Rotary Club of Bwebajja during its formative phase, when it held its meetings on Wednesdays at Akright Stage. My initial connection came through a home hospitality event at PAG Charles Magala's house, where I met some of the members. They were a cheerful group, though their Rotary knowledge was still in its early stages. At that time, my engagement with them was brief, and I didn't dive too deeply into club matters.

A pivotal moment arrived when I was invited to a retreat at MD Dan's home. There, during a candid discussion about club dues, many members realized they were non-compliant, raising questions about their true standing in Rotary. Sadly, this led several members to leave, never to return. But this challenge became a catalyst for change. After much consultation, the club made a strategic decision to move its meeting day to Thursday, allowing me—whose own club RC Kajjansi met on Wednesdays—to become a more regular visitor. Soon after, I was appointed Assistant Governor, and my engagement with the club became more structured and purposeful. When I was later honored with an honorary membership, my bond with RC Bwebajja was cemented.

The club soon shifted its meetings to Cabana Restaurant, a more central and vibrant location. The famous "kimeeza" sessions at Cabana's veranda injected new energy into the club. Despite some lessthan-ideal circumstances, such as the semihygienic restrooms, nothing could dampen our spirits. The friendships were genuine, and the meetings, often accompanied by bottled drinks, were a highlight for many.

Even in this imperfect setting, RC Bwebajja began to achieve remarkable milestones. Dedicated members became Paul Harris Fellows, and under Charter President Gordians' leadership, the club won its first DCA Award for contributions by first-time givers to The Rotary Foundation in its charter year. Friends like No. 10 and PP Miriam breathed new life into the Anns and Andys' dinner, while visionaries like PAG Mo introduced ambitious projects, including a futuristic geriatrics project. It was also in Bwebajja where the "Happy Shilling" concept was born, a fundraising idea that has since been adopted by other clubs in different forms.

Collaborations with other Rotary clubs fueled Bwebajja's growth. Projects such as building a school in Kayunga and early childhood structures at Kyampagi Primary School in Kyotera exemplified the club's community spirit. The Rotaract Club of Bwebajja was birthed and it thrived, becoming a dynamic force in its own right. When I needed a personal assistant during my tenure as District Governor, the choice was clear: Past President JB Ssengooba of the Rotaract Club—now DRR—proved to be the perfect fit, a testament to the vibrancy and resourcefulness of the club.

RC Bwebajja continued to leave a lasting impact through projects like the joint effort with RC Kyotera, which raised over 100 bags of cement for a church floor in Isingiro. Today, the upgraded Nyamuyanja Health Centre stands as a model of excellence, while projects such as the Ngongolo grant and the Tricycle Village Ambulances continue to touch lives. The club's contributions to mega medical camps in Bushenyi, Kamuli, Mubende, Ssembabule, and Namayingo further underscore its commitment to service.

Membership has steadily grown over the years, and with President Andrew at the helm, reaching 100 members is within sight. The inclusion of more honorary members has been a welcome boost, with each contributing in their unique way. PDG Ur's dedication remains unmatched, and the generosity of RIDE Emmanuel has made a profound impact, with more to come.
